The MTA/NJ Boating Industry Scholarship, valued at \$1,000, was presented to Andrew Bayles of Toms River. Andrew has already gained industry experience working at Shore Point Marina in Pine Beach and has excelled in the Marine Service Technology program at Ocean County Vocational Technical School. He will attend the Automotive Training Center in Warminster, PA this fall to continue his studies and become a marine technician.

The MTA/NJ Family Scholarship, valued at \$1,000, is open to MTA/NJ members' children and their employees' children and can be applied to any higher education program. The MTA/NJ Family Scholarship was created in 2014 to give back to our members who generously support the Foundation and help students achieve their educational and career goals. The 2021 MTA/NJ Family Scholarship was awarded to Christopher DeSousa of Oceanport. Christopher will begin his freshman year at Penn State University this fall with a likely focus in business studies. Evan's father Brian DeSousa is President of Bay Agency Insurance Group in Rumson.

In addition, the Automotive Training Center in Warminster, Pennsylvania sponsored a half scholarship to their Marine Technician Program that the MTA/NJ administers and promotes. The recipient of the Automotive Training Center scholarship was Joseph Monteferrante of Audubon. Joseph is graduating from Audubon High School. After completing his educational training, Joseph plans to become a marine technician and hopes to someday own his own marina.
