The MTA/NJ held its Sponsor of the Year Awards at the Annual Dinner. The MTA/NJ established this award eighteen years ago to show its appreciation and to recognize the leading sponsors and supporters of the Association. This year, the MTA/NJ was pleased to be able to award three very deserving and supportive companies. The Top Sponsor of the Year awards went to John B. Wright Insurance Agency of Manasquan, Lockwood Boat Works of South Amboy, and Travelers Ocean Marine Insurance of Edison.

The highlight of the evening included a celebration of the 50th Anniversary of the Association. In 1972, a number of business owners united to have a stronger voice to address the challenges the industry was facing. The first MTA/NJ President, Richard Korman of Capt. Richie's Marina in Forked River was quoted as saying, *"The marine industry currently faces a lack of representation on all levels of government, inaccessibility to area officials, a lack of bargaining power when dealing with suppliers and disunity in other business dealings."*

The MTA/NJ, now 50 years old, is stronger than ever as a powerful organization that affects real change. In her Association update, Melissa Danko highlighted the work of the Association over the years including successes such as the reduced boat sales tax, public access, two highly successful boat shows and the work in helping members navigate through difficult times like the luxury tax, recession, Hurricane Sandy and most recently a pandemic. The Association has worked hard to protect New Jersey's waterways by ensuring they are clean, safe and navigable. In addition, has provided thousands of dollars in scholarships and training dollars to help support and grow the boating industry's workforce, helped grow the industry by bringing new and younger boaters on the water, created partnerships and forged valuable relationships with state agencies, legislators and organizations across the nation.

"It was a wonderful night to celebrate our 50th anniversary and look back on so many accomplishments, successes, events and the incredible people involved along the way," stated Executive Director Melissa Danko. *"I have had the honor of representing the Association for over 20 years and I know that I would not be here if it was not for all those that worked so hard before me. I look forward to continuing the great work of our Association and supporting our members for many more years to come".*

Attendees were able to browse through vintage photos and documents from over the years reflecting on the history and major milestones and accomplishments of the association. Everyone enjoyed a special anniversary cake to close out the evening and parted with an anniversary favor.
